



- 30 years old female

- BMI at presentation 32 kg/m²
- The patient presented with frequent GERD and weight regain.
- Sweet tooth.



Butterfly Gastroplasty









Labs: Hb 10 g/dl, albumin 4 g/dl Preoperative CT gastric volumetry was done.








Operative Plan

To convert the butterfly gastroplasty to RYGB





Postoperative outcome



- The patient discharged POD 2 following uneventful recovery.
- Follow-up showed improved GERD symptoms and satisfactory weight loss.





Conclusion

- Laparoscopic conversion of failed butterfly gastroplasty to RYGB was feasible.
- It may be followed by higher complication rates especially leakage because of fear of ischemia due to vertical and transverse stapling of the stomach
