IMPACT OF A PUBLIC HEALTH POLICY FOR BARIATRIC SURGERY IN A SOUTH AMERICAN COUNTRY

Context

- Currently, bariatric surgery (BS) is recognized as the most effective treatment for obesity worldwide¹.
- Despite obesity being a global epidemic, there is a lack of data on countries that have public health policies (PHP) financing these treatments in private health institutions.

Recent Developments

- In 2022, Chile implemented a public policy targeting obese patients who meet certain criteria.
- This policy has led to a significant increase in both the coverage and the number of bariatric surgeries performed in the country.


Objectives

- The primary objective of this study is to assess the number of bariatric procedures performed in Chile over the past eight years.
- Additionally, the study aims to determine how the public policy has influenced the number and types of procedures performed since 2022.

Methods and Results


- Retrospective study, database from the National Registry of IFSO Chile, 2015 2022.
- To assess the difference in the number of bariatric surgeries following the PHP period, a non-parametric test (Fisher's exact test) was used.
- A total of 68,731 procedures were performed. With the exception of 2017, there has been a constant increase in the annual number of surgeries, from 2.7% between 2015-2016, up to 50% between 2021-2022.
- Besides, there is a statistically significant increase in the number of bariatric surgeries performed after PHP in 2022 (p <0.01).





Methods and Results









- Bariatric surgery in Chile has progressively increased during the assessed period, particularly sleeve gastrectomy and gastric bypass procedures.
- The inclusion of bariatric surgery as a benefit within the Chilean public health system has led to a doubling of surgeries performed compared to previous years.
- In the future, it will be necessary to assess the impact of this policy on obesity-related conditions within the population.
